- CLASS 1 **BROOD MARE** – Grade 1 Brood Mare (RID, AID, SID) with own foal at foot, by RID sire; barren or in foal. **Qualifier for the New Snowford GB Breeding Championship.** To qualify the two highest placed mares must be owned by IDHS (GB) members domiciled in Great Britain, and registered or over stamped Grade 1 (RID,AID,SID) by IDHS (GB) with own foals at foot, born in Great Britain. Foals must be by a RID sire, registered or over stamped by the IDHS (GB) and standing in Great Britain at time of covering. If one or both have already qualified, the mare(s) next in line will go forward to the Final at the IDHS(GB) Annual Breed Show at Arena UK, Allington, Grantham, Lincolnshire, on the 18<sup>th</sup> & 19<sup>th</sup> September 2010. The awards are: Champion; the New Snowford Breeding Trophy, a sash and £100; Reserve Champion: a sash and £50 prize money. Places 3<sup>rd</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup>: a rosette and £20. All prizewinners will receive a Crystal trophy. All other finalists will receive a rosette. In the final each mare and foal will be judged as a pair.
- CLASS 2a **PURE BRED FOAL** – Out of mare in class 1, eligible for Grade 1 Irish Draught Register.
- CLASS 2b **PART BRED FOAL** – Out of mare in class 1, by sire other than RID
- CLASS 3 **YOUNGSTOCK** – 3a; Colt, filly or gelding yearling,  
3b; two/three year filly or gelding, two year old colt,  
by a RID stallion and out of a Grade 1 Mare (RID,AID,SID) - (3b will be split if sufficient entries).  
**Classes 3a & 3b are qualifiers for the NFU Mutual Irish Draught Youngstock Challenge.** The two highest placed Pure Breds from each age group, yearling (filly, colt or gelding), two year old (filly, colt or gelding), three year old (filly or gelding), identified on the Grade 1 Irish Draught Horse Register, by RID sire out of Grade 1 mare (RID, AID, SID). Also 2 and 3 year old fillies already graded (RID/AID). If one or both have already qualified, the horse next in line down in each age group, will qualify for the final at the IDHS (GB) Annual Breed Show at Arena UK, Allington, Grantham, Lincolnshire on 18<sup>th</sup> & 19<sup>th</sup> September 2010. *In the final* there will be three classes each awarding £150 to the 1<sup>st</sup> placed semi-finalist, and £100 to the 2<sup>nd</sup> placed semi-finalist. The two semi-finalists from each class going forward to the Championship, where the Champion will receive £150 prize money, the Reserve Champion will receive £100.

**All ponies at this show must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain and Moorland Stud Books.**

**This Show is a qualifier for The National Pony Society Summer Championship Show to be held at Malvern from August 4<sup>th</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> 2010. All National Pony Society Classes will be judged under NPS Rules. You do not need to be a member of The National Pony Society to compete in any class at this Show. ## NATIONAL PONY SOCIETY CLASSES

**NPS Mountain and Moorland Qualifying Rounds:** These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain and Moorland Stud Books. Part bred are not eligible.

Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS members are eligible to qualify for the final competition, at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from August 4<sup>th</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> 2010

The highest placed pony owned by an NPS member in each class will qualify for the Final. Where this pony has already qualified the pony standing next in line which is owned by an NPS member and has not already qualified receives the qualification. Qualification may go no lower than 3<sup>rd</sup> place. Judges and/or stewards are requested to check membership cards prior to presenting the qualifying rosettes and cards. NPS Adult/Standard members will be required to upgrade to Adult/Showing to enter the Final.

**NPS Silver Medal Rosette Championships.** To be judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the Owner of the champion pony is a Member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the Rider's/Handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion Pony is not a Member, or the Owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette but the Qualification Card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the Owner of that pony is a member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the Qualification Card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve. Please note foals are not eligible for this In Hand Championship.

Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show 4<sup>th</sup> -6<sup>th</sup> August 2010.

**NPS/Rosettes Direct Home Produced Ridden Championship.** This competition is run in conjunction with other NPS Classes. Riders of Home Produced ponies must wear white arm bands. The highest placed home produced pony that has not qualified already, and is owned by an NPS member, qualifies for the final. Qualification cards will be handed out in the following classes at this show.

NPS M&M Open Ridden National Championship, NPS M&M Junior Ridden National Championship, NPS M&M First Ridden National Championship, and NPS M&M Lead Rein National Championship.

**NPS Young Rider Competition.** This competition is for riders up to 25 years of age and is run in conjunction with other NPS Winter and Summer Competitions. Qualification cards will be handed out in the following classes at this show. NPS M&M Open Ridden National Championship, NPS M&M Novice Ridden National Championship, NPS M&M Junior Ridden National Championship, and NPS M&M First Ridden National Championship.

All stallions and colts 2 years old and over to have a current stallion license, unless otherwise governed by their individual Society.

Handler and riders of stallions and colts must have attained their 14<sup>th</sup> birthday by 1<sup>st</sup> January in the current year.

The clashing of classes is an inevitable result of a busy Show. The Show Committee will not be held responsible for any competitor with classes clashing No class will be held for competitors competing in another ring.

Closing Classes – Classes will be closed and ponies/horses will not be allowed into the ring when:-

In Hand – When the last pony/horse has done its 1<sup>st</sup> individual trot

Ridden – When the class goes into trot

WHP – 5 minutes after the last pony/horse has jumped
