

MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND SECTION

All ponies at this show must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain and Moorland Stud Books.

This Show is a qualifier for The National Pony Society Summer Championship Show to be held at Malvern in August 2009. All National Pony Society Classes will be judged under NPS Rules. You do not need to be a member of The National Pony Society to compete in any class at this Show. The Rules for The NPS can be found on their Web site. www.nationalponysociety.org.uk . All competitors must be deemed to have read the present rules of the Society.

NATIONAL PONY SOCIETY CLASSES

NPS Mountain and Moorland Qualifying Rounds: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain and Moorland Stud Books. Part bred are not eligible.

Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS members are eligible to qualify for the final competition.

The highest placed pony owned by an NPS member in each class will qualify for the Final. Where this pony has already qualified the pony standing next in line which is owned by an NPS member and has not already qualified receives the qualification.

Qualification may go no lower than 3rd place. Judges and/or stewards are requested to check membership cards prior to presenting the qualifying rosettes. NPS Adult/Standard members will be required to upgrade to Adult/Showing to enter the Final.

NPS Silver Medal Rosette Championships. To be judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the Owner of the champion pony is a Member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the Rider's/Handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion Pony is not a Member, or the Owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette but the Qualification Card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the Owner of that pony is a member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the Qualification Card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve. Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show 5th -7th August 2009. _

Mixed Mountain and Moorland In Hand Classes

- Class 30 **Small Breeds In Hand** - Stallion, barren mare or gelding, 4 years old or over. Registered in the Pure Bred Society Stud Book of Shetland, Dartmoor, Exmoor and Welsh Section A & B.
- Class 31 **Large Breeds In Hand** – Stallion, barren mare or gelding, 4 years old or over. Registered in the Pure Bred Society Stud Book of Fell, Dales, Highland, Connemara, New Forest, and Welsh Section C & D
- Class 32 **Small Breeds Young stock In Hand** – 1, 2 or 3 year old colt, filly or gelding. Registered in the Pure Bred Society Stud Book of Shetland, Dartmoor, Exmoor and Welsh Section A & B
- Class 33 **Large Breeds Young stock In Hand** – 1, 2 or 3 year old colt, filly or gelding. Registered in the Pure Bred Society Stud Book of Fell, Dales, Highland, Connemara, New Forest and Welsh Section C & D
- Class 34 **large and Small In Hand Brood Mare** – in foal or with foal at foot (foals accompanying a mare must be 3 weeks old or over). Registered in their Pure Bred Society Stud Book.
- Class 35 **Foal of Above.** Must be eligible for Pure Bred Registration. All foals must be a minimum of 3 weeks of age, on the day of the show.

In Hand Championship -1st and 2nd Prize winners in classes 30 to 35 will compete. Champion and Reserve Champion will then go forward to The Supreme Mountain & Moorland Show Championship, and the **NPS/Kilmannan Stud M & M In Hand Silver Medal Rosette Championship**

The Mountain and Moorland In-Hand Champion and the Reserve Champion both qualify for the **ROSEBERRY NORTHERN BREEDERS IN-HAND CHAMPIONSHIP** to be held at the NPS Area 4 North of England Show on Monday August 31st 2009. The Qualifier does not have to be a member of the NPS.

Open to pure bred registered Mountain and Moorland Stallions, Mares and Geldings four years old

Or over.

A pony is not eligible to compete if, before 1st January in the current year, it has done any of the

Following:

- i) Won an open NPS affiliated M & M Ridden Class
- ii) Won a class at an Olympia, HOYS or RIHS qualifying round
- iii) Qualified for HOYS or RIHS
- iv) Qualified for the M & M Novice or Intermediate Ridden final at the NPS Summer Championship show
- v) Qualified for the M & M Ridden Championship final at Olympia in previous years or in the current year

Ponies must be ridden in one of the snaffle bridles illustrated in the NPS Rule Book

Class 39 Welsh B and Welsh C
Class 40 New Forest and Connemara

- Class 43 Open to registered Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland, Welsh A and Welsh B mares and geldings four years old and over. Riders must not have attained their 14th birthday before the 1st January in the current year.
- Class 44 Open to registered Dales, Fell, Highland, New Forest, Connemara and Welsh C mares and geldings four years old and over, not exceeding 138 cm (13.2hh). Riders must not have attained their 18th birthday before the 1st January in the current year
- Class 45 Open to registered Dales, Fell, Highland, New Forest, Connemara and Welsh D mares and geldings four years old and over, exceeding 138cm (13.2hh) but not exceeding 148cm (except for Welsh Section D and Dales). Riders must not have attained their 18th birthday before the 1st January in the current year.

Junior Ridden Championship 1st and 2nd prize winners in classes 43 to 45 will compete.

Champion and Reserve Champion will then go forward to The Supreme Mountain and Moorland Show Championship, and also **the NPS/www.horsequest.co.uk M & M Ridden Silver Medal Rosette.**

- Class 46 Open to registered Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland, New Forest, Welsh A and Welsh B mares and geldings four years old and over not exceeding 122.cm (12.0hh). Riders must have attained their 3rd birthday but must not have attained their 9th birthday before the 1st January in the current year. To be shown in one of the snaffle bridles illustrated in the NPS Rule Book.

The following three classes are experimental for this year and are sponsored by the FPS North East Area Group and the Highland Pony Enthusiasts Club. They will be run under NPS Rules. They are open to all exhibitors but it is hoped that area members will support these classes and NOVICE ponies are particularly welcome. All exhibitors will receive a rosette. The FPS North East Area Group 'summer picnic' will take place on completion of the judging of these three classes and championship.

- Class 57 In Hand Registered Fell Pony, any age.
Class 58 In Hand Registered Highland Pony, any age.
Class 59 Ridden Registered Fell or Highland Pony, four years old or over. Rider any age.

Championship 1st and 2nd prize winners from classes 57 to 59 to compete. The Champion and Reserve Champion will go forward to The Supreme Mountain and Moorland Show Championship.

Class 60 **Young Handlers** Open to any registered Mountain and Moorland Pony or Irish Draught/Sportshorse, mares or geldings only. To be judged on the performance of the handler, not the conformation of horse/pony. Suitability of size of horse/pony to handler will be taken into account. Handlers to be 16 or under on 1st January of the current year. A British Standard riding hat to be worn by all competitors. This class will be split on the day, by age of handler, if entries are sufficient.

THE TAM O'SHANTER IN-HAND, YOUNGSTOCK & BROODMARE CHAMPIONSHIP

QUALIFIER. The highest placed yearling in class 63, the highest placed two year old in class 64, and the Highest placed Broodmare with foal at foot in class 65 will qualify for the final to be held at the BCPS In-Hand Breed Show at Malvern in July 2010

THE ROSMEEN RIDDEN CHAMPIONSHIP. Classes 61 & 62 are qualifiers for The Rosmeen Ridden Championship to be held at the BCPS Ridden Show, Warwickshire Agricultural College, Moreton Morrell, Warwickshire, in July 2010. The first placed or highest placed registered pure bred Connemara (Not exceeding 148cm) to qualify. Qualification, to pass no lower than 3rd place. Exhibitors do not need to be members of the British Connemara Pony society to qualify but **MUST** be a member of the BCPS in order to compete in the final.

Class 61 Novice Ridden Registered Connemara Stallion, mare or gelding 4 years old or over

Rider any age. The Pony must not have won a Ridden Connemara or Mixed Mountain and Moorland Class before January 1st of the current year. To be ridden in a suitable snaffle bridle. Ponies entering class 62 may not enter this class.

Class 62 Ridden Registered Connemara Stallion, mare or gelding 4 years old or over. Rider any age. Ponies entering Class 61 may not enter this class.

Ridden Connemara Championship 1st and 2nd prize winners from classes 61 and 62 to compete. Champion and Reserve Champion will go forward to The Supreme Mountain and Moorland Show Championship, and also the **NPS/www.horsequest.co.uk M & M Ridden Silver Medal Rosette Championship**

Class 63 In Hand Registered Connemara yearling colt, filly or gelding.
Class 64 In Hand Registered Connemara 2 or 3 year old filly or gelding.
Class 65 In Hand Registered Connemara Brood Mare in foal or with foal at foot.
Class 66 Pure Bred Foal of the Above & must be eligible for registration
Class 67 In Hand Registered Connemara Stallion, Barren Mare or gelding 4

years old or over.

Connemara In Hand Championship 1st & 2nd prize winners from Classes 63to 67 compete. Champion and Reserve will go forward to The Supreme Mountain and Moorland Show Championship, and also The **NPS/Kilmannan Stud M & M In Hand Silver Medal Rosette Championship.**

OVERALL CONNEMARA CHAMPIONSHIP Ridden and In Hand Champions and Reserve Champions to compete.
