NB. A horse may only qualify for the Final once, regardless of the type or number of classes won, placed in or entered. Each qualifier will receive a rosette and £10 voucher from Blue Chip. *In the Final*, the Champion will be awarded £1,000 prize money plus a trophy and a Blue Chip rug. The Reserve Champion will be awarded £500 and 3rd to 7th inclusive will be awarded £100 each. In addition, the highest placed Pure Bred will receive a trophy and £100 and the highest placed 15.2hh and under will receive a trophy and £50.

All ponies at this show must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain and Moorland Stud Books.

This Show is a qualifier for The National Pony Society Summer Championship Show to be held at Malvern in August 2009. All National Pony Society Classes will be judged under NPS Rules. You do not need to be a member of The National Pony Society to compete in any class at this Show. The Rules for The NPS can be found on their Web site. www.nationalponysociety.org.uk . All competitors must be deemed to have read the present rules of the Society.

NATIONAL PONY SOCIETY CLASSES

NPS Mountain and Moorland Qualifying Rounds: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain and Moorland Stud Books. Part bred are not eligible. Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS members are eligible to qualify for the final competition.

The highest placed pony owned by an NPS member in each class will qualify for the Final. Where this pony has already qualified the pony standing next in line which is owned by an NPS member and has not already qualified receives the qualification. Qualification may go no lower than 3rd place. Judges and/or stewards are requested to check membership cards prior to presenting the qualifying rosettes. NPS Adult/Standard members will be required to upgrade to Adult/Showing to enter the Final.

NPS Silver Medal Rosette Championships. To be judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the Owner of the champion pony is a Member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the Rider's/Handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion Pony is not a Member, or the Owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette but the Qualification Card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the Owner of that pony is a member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the Qualification Card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve.

Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show 5th -7th August 2009.

It is recommended that all exhibitors and/or competitors are covered by their own Third Party Insurance.

Hard Hats to be worn at all times when riding. It is recommended that body protectors are worn for all jumping phases

Any animal not sufficiently under control in the Judge, Steward or officials opinion will be asked to leave the show ring/ground.

All stallions and colts 2 years old and over to have a current stallion license, unless otherwise governed by their individual Society.

Handler and riders of stallions and colts must have attained Their 14th birthday by 1st January in the current year.

The clashing of classes is an inevitable result of a busy Show. The Show Committee will not be held responsible for any competitor with classes clashing
No class will be held for competitors competing in another ring.

Closing Classes – Classes will be closed and ponies/horses will not be allowed into the ring when:-

In Hand – When the last pony/horse has done its 1st individual trot

Ridden – When the class goes into trot

WHP – 5 minutes after the last pony/horse has jumped

The organisers of this show have taken all reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everybody present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the organisers or the officials and stewards.
